

# Digital Access and Barriers in Displacement-affected Communities in West Darfur, Sudan

Highlights from the end user survey from a Connectivity Needs and Usage Assessment (CoNUA)

West Darfur is a state in western Sudan that shares a border with Chad and is home to nearly 2 million people. More than 900,000 people in West Darfur will need humanitarian assistance in 2022, nearly half of the population. Roughly one in five people in West Darfur are displaced or returnees, 300,000 of whom are internally displaced in Sudan.

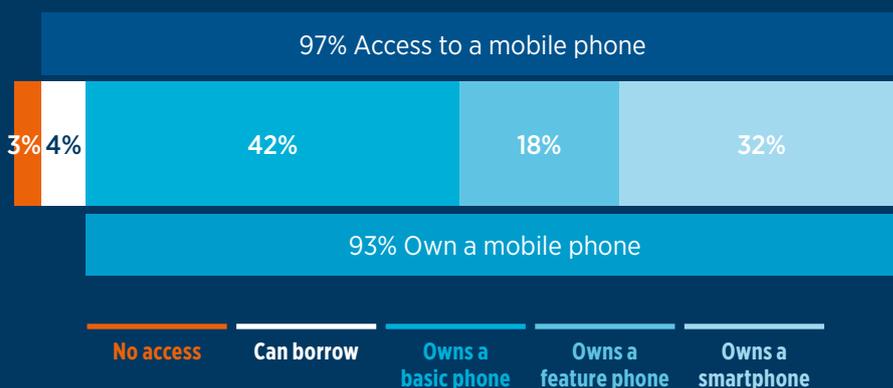


## Access



Most people have access to a mobile phone, with a majority owning one. Half of people own an internet-enabled handset (feature phone or smartphone)

### Individual access to a mobile phone



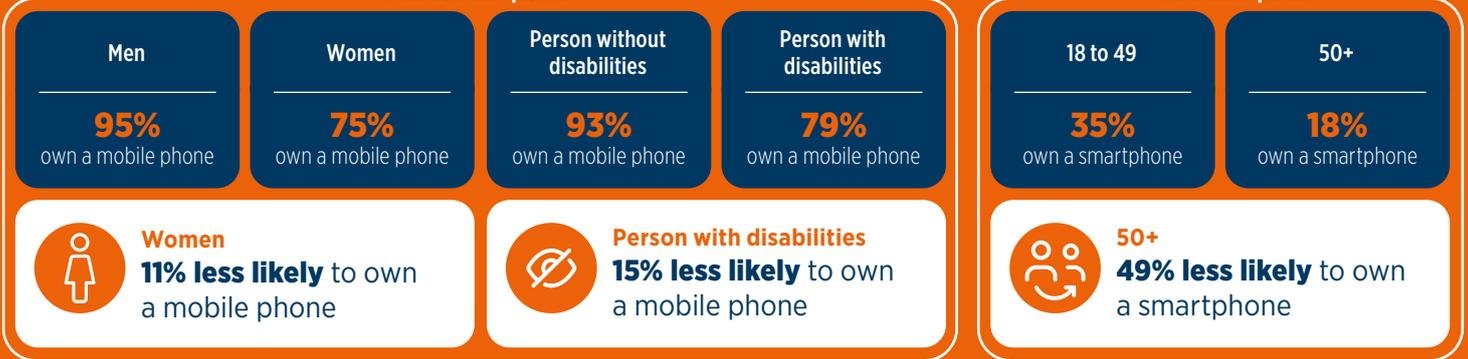

## Women, persons with disabilities, older people and speakers of minority languages were all less likely to own a mobile phone

## Cost presents the biggest barrier to owning a phone

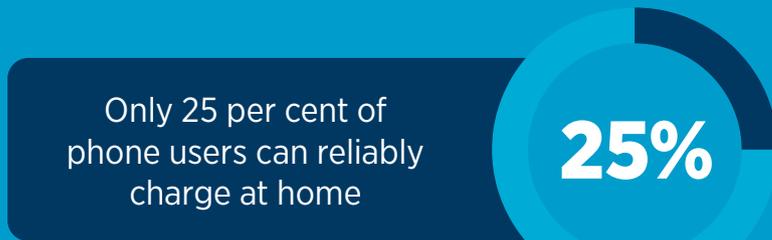
### Top four barriers to mobile phone ownership

Base: all phone owners (1,427)



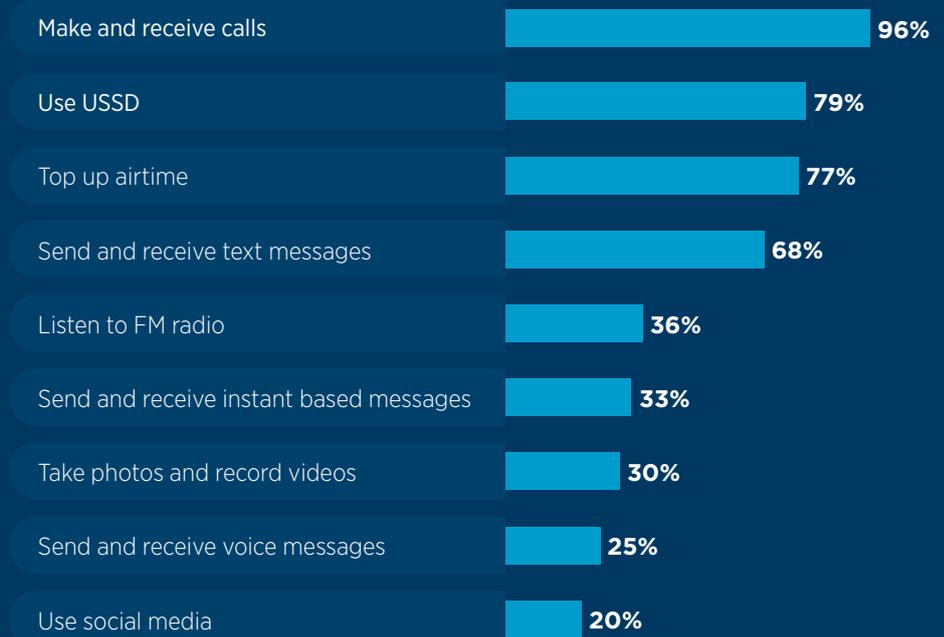
# Usage

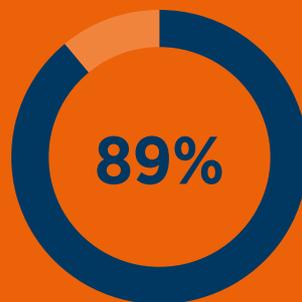
## Knowledge of mobile services, by status



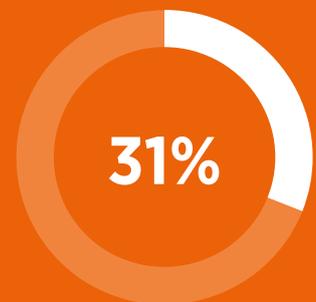
**Whilst awareness of the internet is high, usage is low. Usage remains low even amongst those who own internet enabled phones**

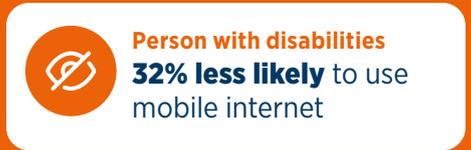
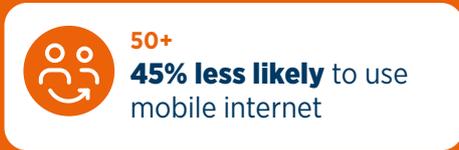
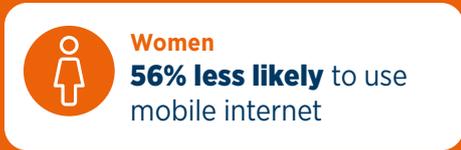
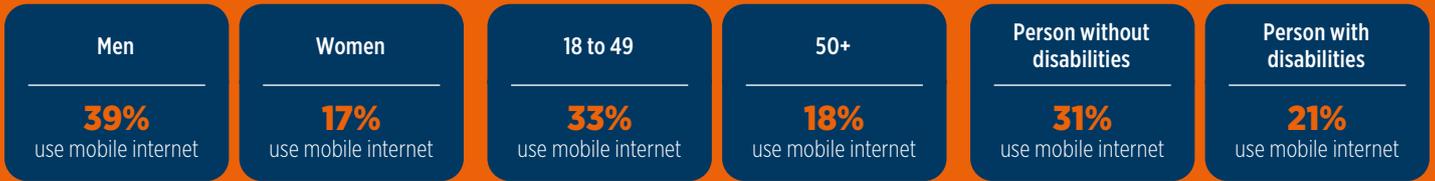
## Internet use is largely for communication

## Very few people use mobile money, though the high prevalence of P2P credit transfer indicates potential unmet consumer need

### West Darfur, Sudan

NRC conducted this assessment in six administrative units and associated settlements that have experienced conflict and associated displacement across West Darfur (El Geneina, Kereinik, Misterei, Murnei, Sileia, Krinding), in January and February 2022. In total 1,547 end user surveys, 44 merchant interviews and 13 signal strength tests were conducted.
