SECTION 3: General terms & conditions (Envelope 1)

1. SCOPE OF BID

- 1.1. The bid is based on the scope of the assignment as determined in Bid Data Sheet (Section 2).
The instruction to bidders should be read in conjunction with the Bid Data Sheet.
- 1.2. The bid is open to bidders registered in Ethiopia on condition that they meet the eligibility criteria

2. CORRUPT PRACTICES

- 2.1. Norwegian Refugee Council requires Employees, Bidders and Contractors, to observe standards of ethics during procurement and the execution of contracts. In pursuit of this, Norwegian refugee Council defines, for the purposes of this provision, the terms set forth below as follows:
 - 2.1.1. "Corrupt practice" includes the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution; and
 - 2.1.2. "Fraudulent practice" includes a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of the Norwegian Refugee Council, and includes collusive practices among Bidders prior to or after bid submission designed to establish bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels and to deprive the Norwegian Refugee Council of the benefits of free and open competition;

In any case where fraud or corruption is identified, NRC will:

- reject any bids where the Bidder has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for the Contract;
 - remove bidding contractors who engage in fraudulent or corrupt practices, from our prequalified list
 - liaise with District Officials to report if fraudulent or corrupt practices are identified
 - terminate contract
- 2.2. Any communications between a Bidder and the Norwegian Refugee Council related to matters of alleged fraud or corruption must be made in writing and addressed to the Country Director in Ethiopia

3. ELIGIBLE BIDDERS

- 3.1. A Bidder shall meet the following criteria to be eligible to participate in NRC procurement of works:
 - 3.1.1. the bidder must provide of:
 - 3.1.1.1. Copy of renewed business license registration certificate
 - 3.1.1.2. Copy of Tax Identification Number (TIN) registration certificate
 - 3.1.1.3. Copy of Value Added Tax (VAT) registration certificate (if VAT is to be charged)
 - 3.1.1.4. Copy of Certificate of Competency (CoC)-**Grade 7 and above**
 - 3.1.1.5. Bid guarantee (Cashier's Payment Order – CPO)
 - 3.1.2. the bidder has submitted all documents requested in Condition 14 of the current Section
 - 3.1.3. the bidder is not subject to sanctions imposed by the United Nations, European Union (or any of its member states) or United States of America
 - 3.1.4. the bidder, at the time of bid, is not:

- 3.1.4.1. insolvent;
 - 3.1.4.2. in receivership;
 - 3.1.4.3. bankrupt; or
 - 3.1.4.4. being wound up
 - 3.1.5. The bidder's business activities have not been suspended;
 - 3.1.6. The bidder is not the subject of legal proceedings for any of the circumstances in 3.1.4; and
 - 3.1.7. The bidder has fulfilled his or her obligations to pay taxes and social security contributions.
- A Bidder, and all parties constituting the Bidder including sub-contractors, shall not have a conflict of interest. All Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified.
- 3.2. A Bidder may be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this bidding process, if they have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about or influence on the bid of another Bidder, or influence the decisions of the Norwegian Refugee Council regarding this bidding process; or
 - 3.3. A Bidder whose circumstances in relation to eligibility change during a procurement process or during the execution of a contract shall immediately inform the Norwegian Refugee Council.
 - 3.4. NRC reserves the right to refuse a bid at any time if the bidder or one of its sub-contractors provided material support or resources to any individual or entity that commits, attempts to commit, advocates, facilitates, or participates or is found guilty of fraud, active corruption, collusion, coercive practice, bribery, involvement in a criminal organization or illegal activity, or immoral human resources practices, including but not limited too: child labour, non-discrimination, freedom of association, payment of the legal national minimum wage, and forced labour.
- 4. BID GUARANTEE (BID SECURITY BOND)**
- 4.1. As part of its bid, the bidder shall submit a bid guarantee equivalent to the value stipulated in the Bid Data Sheet in Section 2. The guarantee should take the form of a Cashier's Payment Order (CPO) issued by a reputable bank. Equivalent financial instruments from reputable banks are also acceptable. The bid guarantee amount is for the entire tender regardless of which lot/ how many lots are being applied to.
 - 4.2. The bid bond is required to ensure that only serious Bidders participate and to protect against the risk of Bidder's conduct, which would warrant the bond's forfeiture
 - 4.3. Any bid that is received that is not secured with a bid guarantee will be declared ineligible and will not be considered further
 - 4.4. Unsuccessful Bidder's bid bond will be returned as promptly as possible but not later than the date of expiration of the period of bid validity
 - 4.5. Successful Bidder's bid bonds will be returned on contract signature and receipt of performance bond
 - 4.6. The bid security will be forfeited:
 - 4.6.1. if a bidder withdraws its bid after the deadline for the submission of bid or otherwise during the period of bid validity specified by the Bidder in the Bid; or
 - 4.6.2. in the case of a successful Bidder, if the Bidder fails:
 - 4.6.2.1. to sign the final contract within 10 days of award; or
 - 4.6.2.2. to furnish performance bond after contract award
- 5. JOINT VENTURES, CONSORTIA AND ASSOCIATIONS**

5.1. Bids submitted by a joint venture, consortium or association of two or more firms as partners must be made clear in the submitted bid. A copy of the formal agreement between the partners will need to be submitted with bid. NRC reserves the right to exclude bids submitted by joint ventures, consortia or associations in case there is a risk that the partnership fails to deliver the required works.

6. ONE BID PER BIDDER PER WORK

6.1. Each Bidder shall submit only one Bid per contract. A Bidder who submits or participates in more than one bid per contract will cause all the bids with the Bidder's participation to be rejected.

7. COST OF BIDDING

7.1. The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of his Bid, and the Norwegian Refugee Council shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.

8. SITE VISIT

8.1. The Bidder, at the Bidder's own responsibility and risk, is encouraged to visit and examine the Site of Works and its surroundings and obtain all information that may be necessary for preparing the bid and entering into a contract for construction of the Works. The costs of visiting the Site shall be at the Bidder's own expense.

9. INSPECTION

9.1. NRC is obliged to ensure that its procurement decisions are clearly justified and documented and keeping within the Donors mandatory principles. In that regard, full and on-the-spot access must be granted to representatives of NRC, the Donor or any organisation or person mandated by it, to premises belonging to NRC or its contractors. The right to access shall include all documents and information necessary to assess, or audit the implementation of the contract

10. OBTAINING AND COMPLETING BIDDING DOCUMENTS

10.1. Bidders are able to obtain the bidding documents either from:

10.1.2. Or bidders can pick-up in person the ITB documents from Logistics Department from Monday to Friday 08:30 to 15:00 from the locations listed in the Bid Data Sheet Section 2.

10.2. The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms, drawings and specifications in the Bidding Document. Failure to furnish all information or documentation required by the Bidding Document may result in the rejection of the bid.

11. CLARIFICATION OF BIDDING DOCUMENT

11.1. A prospective Bidder requiring any clarification of the Bidding Document shall contact the Norwegian Refugee Council in writing. The Norwegian Refugee Council will respond in writing to any request for clarification before the deadline for clarification of bids. The Norwegian Refugee Council shall forward copies of its response to all Bidders who have acquired the Bidding Document, including a description of the inquiry but without identifying its source.

12. AMENDMENT OF BIDDING DOCUMENT

12.1. At any time, prior and until 48 hours prior to the deadline for submission of bids, the Norwegian Refugee Council may amend or cancel the Bidding Document by informing the bidders in writing.

- 12.2. To give prospective Bidders reasonable time in which to take an amendment or cancellation into account in preparing their bids, the Norwegian Refugee Council can, at his discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of bids.

13. LANGUAGE OF BID

- 13.1. The bid, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the bid shall be written in English.
- 13.2. Supporting documents and printed literature that are part of the bid may be in another language provided they are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant passages in English, in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Bid, such translation shall govern.
- 13.3. Any translations must be performed by a translator holding a license to translate, recognized by the Courts and Government of Ethiopia.

14. DOCUMENTS COMPRISING THE BID

- 14.2. All forms must be completed without any alterations to the format, and no substitutes shall be accepted. All blank spaces shall be filled in with the information requested.
- 14.3. Failure to separate the financial elements of the bid (priced offer and/ or any information that indicates the financial value of the bid) from the rest of the bid will automatically be declared ineligible.

15. BID PRICE FOR WORKS CONTRACT

- 15.1. All lots can be awarded to a single bidder, different bidders to different lots or selected lots to a single bidder. As such all should be considered individually with any additional discounts applied if awarded more than one lot. Unless otherwise specified in the Bid Data Sheet, all duties, taxes and other levies payable by the contractor under the contract, shall be included in the total bid price submitted by the bidder.
- 15.2. For those bidders who are VAT registered, VAT must be specified.
- 15.3. The bid price shall include the cost of manpower, the profit of the bidder, use of machinery and any other recurring cost to complete the requested works.

- 15.4. The priced offer submitted by Bidders shall be checked for arithmetical errors and for what might be considered unreasonable rates during the evaluation. Where errors are identified one or more of the following steps may be taken:
- 15.4.1. By default, the financial evaluation of the bid will be based on the unit rate of the line item,
- 15.4.2. If any rates are considered to be unrealistic or unreasonable they may be altered by mutual agreement, provided that no alteration shall be made in the amount of the Bid.
- 15.4.3. If any arithmetical errors are detected in an otherwise acceptable bid, and the Bidder, on being so notified, is prepared to confirm his bid and if the Bidder is subsequently awarded the contract, then the Bid shall be altered to reflect the difference.
- 15.5. The Bidder is reminded that it is entirely his responsibility to ensure the accuracy of his bid. No alteration will be made to the bid after its submission on the grounds of any arithmetical errors subsequently discovered except as provided above.

16. CURRENCIES OF BID AND PAYMENT

- 16.1. All prices shall be quoted by the Bidder in Ethiopian Birr (ETB), unless otherwise stated. Similarly, all payments will be made in the same currency.
- 16.2. By default, payment will be made within 30 days of completion of delivery and submission of all necessary documentation (copy of Purchase Order, Goods Received Note/ Delivery Note, formal invoice). Failure to provide all necessary documents will result in delays

17. BID VALIDITY

- 17.1. Bids shall remain valid for a period of 90 calendar days after the date of the bid submission deadline as prescribed by Norwegian Refugee Council. A bid valid for a shorter period shall be rejected as non-compliant.
- 17.2. In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the bid validity period, the Norwegian Refugee Council may request Bidders in writing to extend the period of validity of their bids. A Bidder must confirm in writing his acceptance of the extension.

18. ALTERNATIVE BIDS

- 18.1. Bidders shall submit offers that comply with the requirements of the bidding documents, including the works specification. Alternative bids shall not be considered unless otherwise indicated in Section 9 – Priced offer where details are provided in Support to Section 5 – Works specification (Envelope 1).

19. FORMAT AND SIGNING OF BID

- 19.1. The Bidder shall prepare one set of bid documents per contract that he wishes to bid for. The bidder should hold a copy of the documents with himself, for reference purposes.
- 19.2. All pages of the submitted tender dossier must be completed, signed and stamped by the bidder
- 19.3. Any corrections/ amendments must be initialled and stamped by the bidder

20. SEALING AND MARKING OF THE BID

- 20.1. The complete bid documents **must be submitted in TWO separate sealed envelopes** that shall be hand delivered at the following NRC Offices not later than the due date indicated in Section 2: Bid Data Sheet.

- 20.2. The envelopes shall:
- 20.2.1. be addressed to the Norwegian Refugee Council, in the location specified in the Bid Data Sheet
 - 20.2.2. bear the Invitation to Bid (ITB) reference number
 - 20.2.3. no other markings should be on the envelope
- 20.3. If envelopes are not sealed and marked as required, the Norwegian Refugee Council will reject the bid

21. DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF BIDS

- 21.1. Bids must be received by the Norwegian Refugee Council at the address given and no later than the date and time indicated in the Bid Data Sheet.

22. CERTIFICATES OF CONFORMITY/ QUALITY ASSURANCE

- 22.1. To the extent possible quality certificates detailing the applicable standards should be submitted with the bid.

23. LATE BIDS

- 23.1. The Norwegian Refugee Council shall not consider any bid that arrives after the deadline for submission as stipulated in the Bid Data Sheet. Any bid received by the Norwegian Refugee Council after the deadline for submission of bids shall be declared late and declared ineligible.

24. WITHDRAWAL AND REPLACEMENT OF BIDS

- 24.1. A Bidder may withdraw or replace its bid after it has been submitted at any time before the deadline for submission of bids by sending a written notice, signed by an authorized representative. Any corresponding replacement of the bid must accompany the respective written notice. All notices must be:
 - 24.1.1. submitted as with Clauses 20 and 21, and in addition, the envelopes shall be clearly marked "WITHDRAWAL" or "REPLACEMENT" and
 - 24.1.2. received by the Norwegian Refugee Council prior to the deadline for submission of bids, in accordance with the Bid Data Sheet
- 24.2. After the opening of bids, modifications to bids must be documented and any discussions reported in writing. A bid may be withdrawn at any stage, with written notice. Withdrawal after the Award Letter has been issued will result in the forfeiture of the Bid Guarantee/ Bond.

25. CONFIDENTIALITY

- 25.1. Information relating to the examination, evaluation, comparison, and post-qualification of bids, and recommendation of contract award, shall not be disclosed to bidders or any other persons not officially concerned with such process until information detailing the best evaluated Bidder is communicated to all Bidders.
- 25.2. Any effort by a Bidder to influence the Norwegian Refugee Council in the examination, evaluation, comparison, and post-qualification of the bids or contract award decisions may result in the rejection of its bid.
- 25.3. From the time of bid opening to the time of Contract award, if any Bidder wishes to contact the Norwegian Refugee Council on any matter related to the bidding process, it should do so in writing.

26. CLARIFICATION OF BIDS

- 26.1. Norwegian Refugee Council may, at its discretion, ask any Bidder for a clarification of its Bid. The Norwegian Refugee Council's request for clarification and the response shall be in writing. Any clarification submitted by a Bidder that is not in response to a request by the Norwegian Refugee Council shall not be considered. All requests for clarifications shall be copied to all bidders for information purposes. No change in the price or substance of the bid shall be permitted, except to confirm the correction of errors.

27. BIDS VALIDATION

- 27.1. The Norwegian Refugee Council's determination of a Bid's validity is to be based on the contents of the bid itself, which cannot be corrected if determined to be invalid
- 27.2. A valid bid is one that complies with all the terms, conditions, and specifications of the Bidding Document, without deviation or omission, which affects, or could affect;
- 27.3. the scope, quality, or performance of the services specified in the Contract; or
- 27.4. limits in any substantial way, the Norwegian Refugee Council's rights or the Bidder's obligations under the Contract

28. EVALUATION OF BID

- 28.1. The Norwegian Refugee Council shall examine the legal documentation and other information submitted by Bidders to verify eligibility, and then will review and score bids according to the following criteria;
 - 28.1.1. Price in comparison to NRC established rate (Financial evaluation)
 - 28.1.2. Quality control of the submitted specifications (Technical evaluation)
 - 28.1.3. Overall timeframe for the works (Technical evaluation)
 - 28.1.4. Earlier experiences and documentation proven in the tender documents, related to the works required under this contract. (Technical evaluation)
 - 28.1.5. In case of two contractors being scored the same in the evaluation, the one with the highest technical ranking will be awarded the contract
- 28.2. Anti-money laundering, anti-bribery, anti-corruption and anti-terrorism legislation applicable in some jurisdictions may require NRC to verify the identity of the bidder prior to financial transactions.
- 28.3. NRC reserves the right to use online screening tools to check the bidder's record with regards to their possible involvement in illegal or unethical practices.
- 28.4. Norwegian Refugee Council reserves the right to reject all bids, and re-tender if no satisfactory bids are submitted

29. AWARD PROCEDURE

- 29.1. The Norwegian Refugee Council shall award the Contract in writing, with an award letter, to the Bidder whose offer has been determined to be the best, before the end of the bid validity period
- 29.2. Any bidder who has not been awarded a contract, will be notified in writing detailing the reasons why their bid was not selected and will have their Bid Guarantee returned to them
- 29.3. Until a formal contract is prepared and executed, the Award Letter shall constitute a binding agreement between the bidder and NRC.
- 29.4. The Award Letter will state the sum that the Norwegian Refugee Council will pay the Contractor in consideration of the works as prescribed in the Contract, and in accordance with the Bid.
- 29.5. The Bidder is thereafter required to submit a Letter of Acceptance together with a performance bond, confirming their wish to proceed with a contract.
- 29.6. If the awarded bidder fails to submit the required performance bond and sign the awarded contract they will forfeit their bid guarantee

30. PERFORMANCE BOND (PERFORMANCE SECURITY)

- 30.1. The successful bidder is required to submit a performance bond valued at 20% of the contract value and is required to ensure delivery according to the contract agreement.
- 30.2. The performance bond must be valid for at least three months more than the duration of the contract/ maximum delivery lead time.
- 30.3. Failure to submit the required performance bond will result in the bid guarantee being forfeit.
- 30.4. The performance bond will returned after all deductions due to late delivery have been made from the final payment and the successful bidder has submitted the defect liability bond.

31. SIGNING OF CONTRACT

- 31.1. Upon receipt of the Letter of Acceptance and performance bond, the Norwegian Refugee Council shall call the successful Bidder to sign the Contract.
- 31.2. Within an agreed timeframe, the successful Bidder shall sign, date, and return the Contract to the Norwegian Refugee Council.

32. SUB-CONTRACTING

- 32.1. Sub-contracting over 20% of the value of the bid must be clearly stipulated in the bidding documents with proof of the sub-contracting arrangement being made available. Failure to declare any sub-contracting arrangements that exceed 20% prior to contract signature may result in the contract being voided without compensation regardless of progress of work.

33. DEFECT LIABILITY BOND (GUARANTEE)

- 33.1. The successful bidder is required to submit a defect liability bond equivalent to 10% of the value of the completed works.
- 33.2. The defect liability bond must remain valid for at least six months after the completion certificate is signed
- 33.3. Failure to remedy any defects that become apparent during the defect liability guarantee that the contractor fails to remedy within two weeks will result in the defect liability being used to hire another contractor to put right the defect

- 33.4. Defects are defined as deficiencies in the initial work and excludes misuse or normal wear and tear
- 33.5. Failure to submit a defect liability guarantee will result in the performance bond being forfeited.

SECTION 4: Ethical Standards (Envelope 1)

NRC as a humanitarian organisation expects the suppliers and contractors to have high ethical standards. Any organization supplying goods to NRC valued at over USD10,000 in one year must sign this declaration. This declaration will be kept on file for a period of 7 years and should be updated every year or more often as appropriate.

NRC staff may perform checks to verify that these standards are adhered to. Should NRC deem that the supplier fails to meet or is not taking appropriate steps to meet these standards, any and all contracts and agreements with NRC may be terminated.

Anyone doing business with Norwegian Refugee Council shall as a minimum;

- a. Comply with all laws and regulations in effect in the country or countries of business, AND;
- b. Meet the ethical standards as listed below, OR;
- c. Positively agree to the standards and be willing to implement changes in their organisation.

1. ANTI-CORRUPTION AND COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS AND REGULATIONS:

- 1.1. The supplier confirms that it is not involved in any form of fraud, corruption, collusion, coercive practice, bribery, involvement in a criminal organization or other illegal activity.
- 1.2. Where any potential conflict of interest exists between the supplier or any of the suppliers staff members with any NRC staff member, the supplier shall notify NRC in writing of the potential conflict. NRC shall then determine whether action is required. A conflict of interest can be due to a relationship with a staff member such as close family etc.
- 1.3. The supplier will immediately notify senior NRC management if exposed for alleged corruption by representatives of NRC.
- 1.4. The supplier shall be registered with the relevant government authority with regard to taxation.
- 1.5. The supplier shall pay taxes according to all applicable national laws and regulations.
- 1.6. The supplier warrants that it is not involved in the production or sale of any weapons including anti-personnel mines.

2. CONDITIONS RELATED TO EMPLOYEES:

- 2.1. No workers in our company will be forced, bonded or involuntary prison workers.
- 2.2. Workers shall not be required to lodge "deposits" or identity papers with their employer and shall be free to leave their employer after reasonable notice.
- 2.3. Workers, without distinction, shall have the right to join or form trade unions of their own choosing and to bargain collectively.
- 2.4. Persons under the age of 18 shall not be engaged in work which is hazardous to their health or safety, including night work.
- 2.5. Employers of persons under the age of 18 must ensure that the working hours and nature of the work does not interfere with the child's opportunity to complete his/ her education.
- 2.6. There shall be no discrimination at the work place based on ethnic background, religion, age, disability, gender, marital status, sexual orientation, union membership or political affiliation.
- 2.7. Measures shall be established to protect workers from sexually intrusive, threatening, insulting or exploitative behaviour, and from discrimination or termination of employment on unjustifiable grounds, e.g. marriage, pregnancy, parenthood or HIV status.

- 2.8. Physical abuse or punishment, or threats of physical abuse, sexual or other harassment and verbal abuse, as well as other forms of intimidation, shall be prohibited.
- 2.9. Steps shall be taken to prevent accidents and injury to health arising out of, associated with, or occurring in, the course of work, by minimizing, so far as is reasonably practicable, the causes of hazards inherent in the working environment.
- 2.10. Wages and benefits paid for a standard working week shall meet, at a minimum, national legal standards or industry benchmark standards, whichever is higher. Wages should always be enough to meet basic needs.
- 2.11. Working hours shall comply with national laws and benchmark industry standards, whichever affords greater protection. It is recommended that working hours do not exceed 48 hours per week (8 hours per day).
- 2.12. Workers shall be provided with at least one day off for every 7-day period.
- 2.13. All workers are entitled to a contract of employment that shall be written in a language they understand.
- 2.14. Workers shall receive regular and documented health and safety training, and such training shall be repeated for new workers.
- 2.15. Access to clean toilet facilities and to potable water, and, if appropriate, sanitary facilities for food storage shall be provided.
- 2.16. Accommodation, where provided, shall be clean, safe and adequately ventilated, and shall have access to clean toilet facilities and potable water.
- 2.17. No Deductions from wages shall be made as a disciplinary measure.

3. ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS:

- 3.1. Production and extraction of raw materials for production shall not contribute to the destruction of the resources and income base for marginalized populations, such as in claiming large land areas or other natural resources on which these populations are dependent.
- 3.2. Environmental measures shall be taken into consideration throughout the production and distribution chain ranging from the production of raw material to the consumer sale. Local, regional and global environmental aspects shall be considered. The local environment at the production site shall not be exploited or degraded by pollution.
- 3.3. National and international environmental legislation and regulations shall be respected.
- 3.4. Hazardous chemicals and other substances shall be carefully managed in accordance with documented safety procedures.

SECTION 5: Works specifications (Envelope 1)

SECTION 5: Works specifications (Envelope 1)

1 QUALITY ASSURANCE

1.1 General requirements:

- i. The minimum acceptable qualities of materials and workmanship have been established in this Technical specification by reference to accepted standards, codes or descriptions of required performance. The Engineer has established requirements in each section for the advance submittal of data for review and approval. Such required data shall be submitted and reviewed and resubmitted as frequently as required until compliance with the specific requirements has been obtained.
- ii. Each data for submittal shall be carefully reviewed and verified for its compliance with the specific requirement of the submittals called for in each section of this Specification.
- iii. The approval by the Engineer of submittals is in no way considered as a guarantee or relief from replacing, the material
- iv. supplied or work executed, if the materials and workmanship are found defective by tests carried out thereafter. Such materials and workmanship found to be defective shall be replaced at no cost to the Investor.
- v. All data, samples, test results, certificates, designs, drawings, etc., to be submitted shall fully comply with the requirements as specified in each section of this Specification.

1.2 Qualification of Workmen

- i. Adequate number of workmen who are skilled/trained and experienced in the necessary crafts and who are thoroughly familiar with the specified requirements and methods needed for the proper performance of the work in each section of this Technical Specification shall be provided by the Contractor.
- ii. In addition to this general requirement, the specific requirements as stated under each section of this Specification shall be met.

1.3 Cost Included

- i. Cost of materials as indicated on drawings or specified in the Technical Specification, Bill of Quantities, Schedules, etc., labor, equipment, tools, temporary works, supervisory personnel and related items required for the satisfactory execution of an item shall be borne by the contractor whether or not specified.

2 EXCAVATION AND EARTHWORKS

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Work Included

- i. Provide all necessary tools, equipment and manpower necessary to satisfactorily execute excavation and earthwork.

2.1 Qualification of Workmen

- I. Operators of equipment and men guiding laborers in earthwork shall be skilled workmen thoroughly trained and experienced in the necessary crafts. Provide at least one person thoroughly familiar with the specified requirements of the work in this Specification.

2.2 Site Clearance

- I. Site clearance shall be carried out in accordance with the direction of the Engineer for the area to be cleared. Bushes, vegetation and undergrowth shall be removed from sites required to be cleared. Trees and bushes shall be uprooted, raked and disposed of, deposited or burnt as directed by the Engineer. Holes left by stumps and roots shall be filled with suitable material and compacted to approval by the Engineer.

2.3 Site clearance

- II. shall be measured by area and shall be understood as including trees up to 80mm in diameter.

2.4 Backfill

- III. Selected borrowed fill - Suitable non-expansive well graded soil or granular material with no rock lumps imported from outside and approved by the Engineer.

2.5 Disposal

- I. All unsuitable and surplus suitable material arising from excavations shall be disposed of when instructed by the Engineer.
- II. Disposal shall be made to tips directed by the Engineer or indicated in the document. In the absence of direction from the Engineer or indication in the documents, it is the contractor's responsibility to identify the appropriate tip and dispose the material.

2.6 Hard core & stone filler

- 3 Hard core shall be sound approved stone of specified finishing thickness and placed as directed by the Engineer and finished blinded with 20mm crushed aggregate.
- 4 Hard core shall be measured by the area of the surface on which it is laid if the finished thickness does not exceed 300mm. Hard core and stone filling exceeding 300mm thickness shall be measured by the volume of void filled by the hard core or stone chipping.
- 5 The girths of sinking shall be taken as the surface area of hard core where such sinking occur.

3 MASONRY WORKS

DEFINITIONS

- i. Below grades wall shall mean masonry to the level of ground floor whether slab is resting on ground or suspended.
- ii. Above grade wall shall mean masonry above ground floor.

GENERAL REQUIREMENT

WORK INCLUDED

- i. Provide all masonry material, mortar, and tie as indicated on drawing and specified herein, and labor, equipment, tools, scaffolding for masonry works, as required for the satisfactory installation of the works.

3.1 STONE FOR MASONRY

- i. Stone obtained from quarries approved by the Engineer shall be hard & sound, free from vents, cracks, fissures, discoloration, or other defects that will adversely affect strength or appearance. Stone chips out of which shaped stone are to be produced shall not be less than 450mm average and 380mm individual length.

4 CONCRETE WORK

4.1 CAST IN PLACE CONCRETE

DEFINITION

- i. Cast in place concrete is concrete premixed at a batching plant and transported to the work site or concrete whose ingredients are transported to the site and mixed just before casting in place.

GENERAL REQUIREMENT

Work Included

- i. Provide cement, aggregate, water admixture, labor equipment and tools for cast in place concrete as required for the satisfactory installation of the works.

PRODUCTS

4.2 Materials for Concrete

➤ Cement

- i. Cement shall be "Ordinary Portland or Portland " manufactured by an approved firm and shall comply in all respects with the requirements
- ii. "Rapid Hardening Portland cement" may be used, subject to prior approval by the Engineer in order to speed up the progress of the works.
- iii. Cement shall be used in the order delivered. It shall be visually checked and tested before being used. Set or partially set cement bags shall be immediately removed from the site.
- iv. If required, manufacturers test certificate for each consignment of cement, shall be issued with the consignment. Further tests for fineness and compressive strength for consignment already delivered shall be made when required by the Engineer.
- v. The cement content of a concrete mix shall correspond to the mix proportion indicated under the Class of concrete of this Technical Specification.

4.3 Aggregate

➤ FINE AGGREGATES:

- I. Shall be natural or crushed gravel or stone, clean sharp coarse grit, pit or river sand to conform with the requirements

➤ COARSE AGGREGATE:

- I. Shall be hard clean gravel or broken stones, durable, non-porous and free from harmful matter. It shall conform to the requirement

4.4 Water

- I. Water for concrete shall confirm to the requirements of ASTM C94.
- II. Water shall be from an approved source and shall be clean, free from oil, acid, alkali, or any vegetable or organic matter harmful to any material with which it is used.
- III. If available drinking water piped supply shall be used.

5 REINFORCEMENT

DEFINITIONS

- I. Reinforcement work shall be understood as the supply and fixing of reinforcement bars, including ties and chairs.

GENERAL REQUIREMENT

Work included

- I. Provide reinforcing bars, welded fabric reinforcement, tie wire, chairs, labor and tools for the satisfactory placement of reinforcement works.

5.1 Preparation

- I. Formwork and conditions under which reinforcement is to be placed shall be examined and corrected prior to the placement of concrete.

6 HOLLOW & SOLID CONCRETE BLOCKS

6.1 Manufacture and Curing

- I. Concrete blocks shall be obtained from an approved supplier or may be manufactured on site. Samples and test results shall be submitted for approval by the Engineer before any blocks are delivered or used in the construction of the works.
- II. Blocks shall be manufactured from cement and aggregates complying with the requirements or pumice with no fine volcanic dust.
- III. Blocks shall be uniform in texture, shape, size, with sharp arises and free from any cracks or defects.

7 Roof Work

- I. tie bars embedded in, or tied around support shall be used to tie truss and rafter secure in position.

7.1 Post Truss and Rafter

- II. Trusses and rafters shall be fabricated from eucalyptus or other equivalent posts complying with Specification. Trusses and rafter shall be fabricated as detailed in drawings.
- III. Members shall be spliced where necessary, securely nailed to each other and tied with mild steel bands at all joints.
- IV. Trusses and rafters shall be securely tied to supports detailed on drawings. Where no details are shown, 6 or 8mm diameter mild round steel

7.2 Purlins

- I. Purlins shall be produced from eucalyptus or other equivalent posts complying with Specification which is 5cm*7cm sectional size Australia timber purlins

8 Metal and Steel work

8.1 Doors and windows

- i. doors & windows shall be side, bottom or top hinged produced from any one of the following.
- ii. f Galvanized steel profiles
- iii. f Black or preprinted mild steel profile
- iv. doors and windows shall be as shown in the schedule of door and windows or specified in drawings.

9. PLASTER & POINTING

GENERAL REQUIREMENT

- I. Work Included
- II. Provide cement, sand, aggregate, labor, equipment and tools for plaster & pointing as required for the satisfactory installation of the works.
- III. 9. Concrete Paving
- IV. Concrete in-situ or precast paving shall be in class C-20 concrete, complying with the general requirements of concrete and precast concrete.
- V. The paving in specified thickness shall be laid on compacted earth/fill and 50mm sand or blinding concrete bedding and joint pointed with cement mortar or filled with clear natural sand.

10 Painting

GENERAL REQUIREMENT

- i. Work Included
- ii. provide all backing and painting material, necessary labor and tools for the preparation, priming and painting of surfaces and cleaning up at work completion.
- iii. Standards comply with the following standards:
- iv. Glue size for decorators' use
- v. Lead based priming paints
- vi. Metallic zinc rich priming paints
- vii. Mineral solvent for paints

11 Qualification of Workmen

- I. Painters shall be skilled workmen who are thoroughly trained and experienced in the necessary crafts. In addition to these requirements, assign at least one person who is thoroughly familiar with the specified requirements and capable of guiding the trade's men in the selection of materials and execution of the works of this section.
